Areas to Use: Switch the web site to “World History: Ancient”

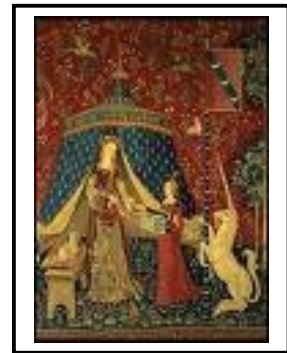
Citation: Click on the ‘cite’ button at the top or the bottom right-hand corner of the articles for the citation information.

Facts-on-File:

Login ID: wildcats

Password: wildcats

Citation: Information is at the bottom of the article.



Gale Student Resource Center:

Login ID: wildcats

Areas to Use: Select the “Student Resource—Gold”
Click on “History Search” then begin your search

Citation: Information is at the end of the article.

Proquest History Center:

Login: lhslibrary

Password: wildcats

Areas to Use: elect “History Study Center”

Citation: Information is at the top before the article.

Step #4:

Use the Internet wisely. Set up a good internet search when you use Google. Remember to use the “+” and “-“ symbols to narrow down the search.

For example: Black Plague
“Black Plague” +”Middle Ages” –com +edu

If you need help narrowing your thesis, try the search engine, [Vivisimo.com](http://www.vivisimo.com). It clusters topics on the left-hand side that could help you focus your topic.
